Squawk



1a (KS1): Draw on knowledge of vocabulary to understand texts.

2a (KS2): Give/explain the meaning of words in context.

Squawk is a clever bird who likes to clarify and explain what words mean. He likes to use his knowledge of words to understand what he is reading.

Pearl

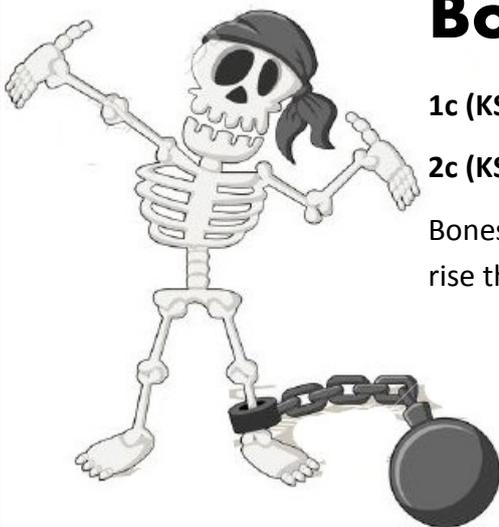


1b (KS1): Identify and explain key aspects of fiction and non-fiction texts, such as characters, events, titles and information.

2b (KS2): Retrieve and record information/identify key details from fiction and non-fiction.

Pearl finds information and identifies key features of texts, and uses her sword to help her skim and scan. She likes to explain the details of what she has found!

Bones



1c (KS1): Identify and explain the sequence of events in texts.

2c (KS2): Summarise main ideas from more than one paragraph.

Bones likes to keep things simple! The bare bones! He likes to summarise the key points of what he has read, and put events in order.

Patch



1d (KS1): Make inferences from the text.

2d (KS2): Make inferences from the text/explain and justify inferences with evidence from the text.

Old pirate Patch loves to use the clues in the text to discover what hasn't been directly said! He searches the text for evidence with his telescope!

Merlin



1e (KS1): Predict what might happen on the basis of what has been read so far.

2e (KS2): Predict what might happen from details stated and implied.

Merlin is an eager young pirate—he likes to rush ahead and predict what will happen next.

Captain Conker

2f (KS2): Identify/explain how information/narrative content is related and contributes to meaning as a whole.

Captain Conker has conquered the seven seas, and he likes to tell old stories and tales and put his adventures in context. He links his stories to what he is doing now!



Lolly

2g (KS2): Identify/explain how meaning is enhanced through choice of words and phrases.

Lolly loves languages, and often carefully up-levels her words and phrases to make her work better. She is good at explaining how certain words make a piece of work better.

Otto

2h (KS2): Make comparisons within the text.

Otto loves reading, and likes to compare facts and figures within texts. He can recognise the differences between characters in a text and explain the differences between them.
